6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college has an Academic Committee, which sits periodically on the issues related to curriculum and within its limited scopes takes initiative in this respect in the following ways:

- i) Departmental seminars, home assignment and dissertation carried out by the respective department under the supervision of Academic Committee of the college.
- ii) Departmental research and project committee formed and supervision of project work and field study by the students.
- iii)Feedback from learners on teaching of curriculum is discussed in HoDs meeting and suggestions are made for improvement in the curriculum over telephone to the affiliating University. Guardian feedback also taken to enhance the quality of the institution.
- iv)The departmental library and central library procure text books relevant to curriculum and provide priority and special consideration to the needy and deserving students.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

For quality teaching and learning, the academic calendar, class routine and teaching plans are prepared before the commencement of the class. The course content, lesson allotted to individual faculty is intimated to the learners at the beginning of the classes.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college takes initiative to promote research activities and adopt some strategies in this regard such as- information of the international/national/state/local level seminars, of research journals are provided for easy access to the teachers and students. Logistic support is given.

As a result, 01 faculty members were awarded PhD, 08other faculty members are pursuing PhD, 02 UGC Short Term Course participated. No. of publication increased. 05 book chapters, 25 papers in National and International journals were published. Participation in National/ International Seminars also increased. 42 papers were presented in national Seminars and 13 faculty members were attended workshop.

Initiative was also taken to promote research culture among students. The students of 06 departments carried out project work and of 04 departments carried out dissertation work. Besides, 32 departmental seminars were held.

258 students undertook field-based study on environmental issues. Besides, 28 students undertook educational tour to Thimphu, Bhutan, where a forum talk on cultural idea exchange has been organised in Royal Thimphu College. The minister of Higher Education, Bhutan has also share academic ideas with our students and teachers.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- More books were purchased for library.
- Ease-to access has been initiated in the central library by implementing SOUL2.0.
- Four computers have been added to the total computer strength.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The college ensured proper management of human resources available in the college through judicious distribution of duties and responsibilities. Faculty and staff training are also done on necessity

So far students are concerned, the college endeavours to develop human resource primarily through successful implementation of curriculum to bring the desired goal.

Effort was made for the leadership and healthy competitive spirits among students through Students' Union, NSS and NCC unit, College Magazine, organisation of sports and cultural activities, extension activities, etc. for development of human resource. Research culture among students was promoted through project/ field based work. Skill development programmes were undertaken.

Coaching class on reasoning and general awareness was conducted for empowerment of students to appear in competitive examinations.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of teachers and other employees are made as per the guidelines of UGC as well as the state government.

Part-time teachers are recruited as and when necessary. This year part-time teacher were recruited in the department of Political science, Education, Philosophy, Arabic, Hindi, Assamese and Anthropology

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The college has no formal industry interaction/ collaboration. However, the students are given information of the industries and reputed institution and are guided to get into those. Efforts are being made to have collaboration with institutions.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- An admission Committee is formed every year, which follows government rules related to reservation and admission.
- The selection of students for admission into different classes is done strictly on merit. To maintain transparency in this regard, merit list is hung up in the college notice board one day prior to the date of admission.

ANALYSIS OF STUDENTS' FEEDBACK: A SUMMARY YEAR: 2015-16

Feedback from students and alumni is taken for the session 2015-16 to improve the teaching-learning process of the institute. In this regard, the present student feedback system adopts randomized sampling method, where 169 undergraduate level students from 13 departments and 30 alumni have been interviewed. As a tool of investigation, closed ended questionnaire is constructed using LIKERT scale. The questionnaire for students basically encompasses five broad areas, e.g., assessment of teacher, assessment of administration, assessment of support system, assessment of library and assessment of basic requirements. The five broad areas are sub-divided into 24 statements. The questionnaire for alumni encompasses areas like overall development of college, student-teacher relation, cooperation to students, etc., which covers 14 statements.

Summary of Feedback Analysis:

- ✓ The feedback reflects that teachers must give due importance on the requirements of syllabus, timely organization of home assignments and seminars and guiding on how to answers the questions of both internal and external examinations.
- \checkmark The feedback suggests that the college office needs to be more students friendly and the support staff must provide adequate required information to the students.
- ✓ The feedback also suggests that library staff should be more supportive and co-operative towards students. Besides, utilisation of library resource is average and the result suggests better utilisation. The result also suggests procuring more qualitative book.
- ✓ Alumni feel that overall development of the college is satisfactory, but the recent development of classrooms, library facility and sports facility is below average and these areas should be strengthened to make the institute a centre of excellence.

The feedback is analysed and discussed in the general meeting, where measures are identified and suggested for necessary implementation.

Practice 1: Departmental Seminar with external expert

- HoD departments are entrusted to make seminar announcement and to carry necessary steps for conduction of the seminar.
- External expert is invited by the Head of the institution.
- Students have to prepare a presentation and to perform it before the departmental teacher and external expert.

The college has been able to achieve the goal in organising departmental seminar. In 2015-16 27 departmental seminars with external experts have been conducted, which make a sense to the students.
