Baosi Banikanta Kakati College - A Profile

Baosi Banikanta Kakati College was established at Nagaon of greater Baosi locality on 25th July, 1971. This college came into existence as a result of the indefatigable effort of Late Mahendra Mohan Choudhury, a noted freedom fighter, former Chief Minister of Assam and former Governor of Punjab. Baosi was once a seat of diverse cultural and religious activities of Vaishnavite Preacher Mahapurush Srimanta Shankardeva and his disciple Mahapurush Madhabdeva along with Damodardev and Haridev. Then in the late 19th century, Baosi was endowed with a worthy son of Assam, Dr. Banikanta Kakati. Dr. Kakati was a great scholar, linguist, literary critic and academician of great repute. Thus, the name of the college Baosi Banikanta is conflation of 'Baosi' and 'Banikanta Kakati'.

Baosi Banikanta Kakati College is ideally nestled amidst the lush green paddy fields and sylvan serenity, 12 kilometres away from the din and bustle of the urban atmosphere of Barpeta town. "Gurukulashram". As this is essentially a rural college, the academic needs of the local populace is given utmost importance. Since the inception, the college has been able to keep intact the attraction of the youths as a preferred destination of higher education in lower Assam. In this way the college, having the special focus on relevant present day educational drives along with the emphasis on all round development of the students has successfully completed the 48th year of academic excellence.

Environmental Studies

Compulsory subjects : Functional English (upto 2nd sem.), Environmental Studies (3rd & 4th Sem.)

Duration of all B.A/BSc/BCA Degree Courses

The duration of the courses shall be of three years consisting of six semesters.

COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS IN DEGREE COURSES

If CBCS is introduced in UG level from the session 2019-20, the guidelines and instructions given by Gauhati University shall be followed.

1. **B.A.** General English and MLL subjects are compulsory. An applicant having major in any one of the following subjects will have to take any one as subsidiary subject from the following list. Applicants without major will have to opt for any two of the following subsidiary subjects.

2. **B.Sc.** Functional English is compulsory. A student will be allowed to take one of the following subject combinations along with the major subject.

3. **BCA** Eligibility: Minimum requirement for admission to the course is H.S. or equivalent examination in any stream. Student not from Science stream will have to take up a Bridge course in addition to the normal course in the 1st semester.

4. Post Graduate Diploma Course in Computer Application (PGDCA)

Course Duration : The duration of the course is one year consisting of two Semesters.

Eligibility: A student with a Bachelor Degree of 10+ 2+ 3 pattern in any discipline is eligible for the course, preferably students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level and obtaining minimum pass mark in the subject is eligible for admission. Candidates not having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level will have to pursue a Bridge course.

5. Courses under Distance mode

The college is going to introduce various courses under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) for the session 2019-20.

Free admissions shall be subject to the order & notification of Govt. of Assam. Income certificates produced at the time of Admission should be issued by either Mouzadar or SDC.

COLLEGE UNIFORM

College uniform is compulsory for all students.

For boys : Pink coloured shirt and ash coloured trousers

For girls : Pink coloured Kurta and white salwar (trousers) with white dupatta or pink coloured blouse and white mekhela chadar with pink border.

COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

New Identity cards are issued to the fresh students. Old Identity Cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic session. For renewal of Identity Card an additional amount will be charged.

Students are advised to keep the college identity card with them during college hours.

ADMISSION AND ATTENDANCE

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Application for admission into the college should be made in prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 150/- (Rupees one hundred fifty) only.
- ❖ Application form must be accompanied by attested copies of relevant documents and two passport sized photographs duly signed by the applicant.
- ❖ Original copies of Mark sheet of the last qualifying examinations, Age certificate, Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended and Caste certificate will have to be produced by the candidates at the time of interview.
- ❖ Students passing the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the institution last attended or an affidavit.
- ❖ Admission into the college is strictly made on merit basis and is governed by the college admission rules. The Principal's decision is final in this regard.
- ❖ Reservation of seats is as per Govt. rule.
- ❖ A few seats are reserved for students having extra-curricular activities in the field of sports, culture and NCC.
- ❖ HS and Degree students who have failed may also apply for admission along with the fresh applicants. However no extra preference will be given to them.

ADMISSION OF UNSUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

- Students detained at the Final Examination will be re-admitted to the respective classes. They must attend regular classes to appear in the Final examination.
- Unsuccessful candidates of HS (Sc.) final examination who appeared from this college shall have to attend requisite number of Practical classes by enrolling their names as casual students to appear in the final examination. Unsuccessful candidates of HS (Arts) final examination shall have to get their names enrolled as casual students to appear in the final examination.
- The unsuccessful students of HS 1st year will have to take admission as casual students just after the completion of regular admission in HS 1st year.
- The procedure of admission of unsuccessful candidate of Degree semester system is mentioned in the section "Examination Rule and Evaluation System of Semester Course."

ATTENDANCE RULE

- ❖ Students having less than 75% class attendance will not be allowed to fill up forms of HS 1st year and Final examination.
- ❖ Degree students must have 75% of class attendance in order to fill up forms of Final examination of Gauhati University.
- ❖ For allotting Internal Assessment marks in Degree examination, at least 75% attendance of the total number of classes held is necessary.
- ❖ Regular attendance in classes will give extra weightage to the internal marks.

CREDIT & GRADING : As per G.U. guidelines. The guidelines are available in every department

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- ❖ The students admitted to the college must abide by all the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violations of the rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which will lead to disciplinary action.
- ❖ Every student must carry their 'Identity Card' inside the campus. It must be produced for verification when demanded by the authority.
- ❖ Every student must wear the college uniform inside the college campus.
- ❖ Prior permission of the authority is necessary to represent the college at outside forums.
- ❖ Use of cellular phone is strictly prohibited inside the classroom during class & examination hours.
- ❖ Students should keep college campus clean. Spitting, smoking, disfiguring the walls etc. are strictly prohibited. Any student found guilty of doing so shall be subject to expulsion from the college.
- ❖ All forms of ragging inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Consumption of gutkha, sikhar and other alcoholic or narcotic drugs in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal. In all cases, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding.

EXAMINATION RULES AND EVALUATION PROCESS

Examination Rules (General)

The authority strictly adheres to the College Examination and Promotion rules. There will be a unit test examination for HS 1st and 2nd year students and in addition, a test examination for HS 2nd year students. There will be a sessional examination for the degree courses on the dates prescribed in the prospectus of the college. Based on this, students will be allowed to fill up the forms of final examinations held by AHSEC / Gauhati University. Students unable to appear in a test on medical grounds must submit application along with medical certificates prior to the test. Under no circumstances, medical certificates will be entertained in more than one test.

Examination Rules and Evaluation of TDC under Semester System

- ❑ TDC consists of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below:
 - a. First, Third and Fifth Semester: July to December (including examinations).
 - b. Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January to June (including examinations).
 - c. Semester Break: As per notification of Gauhati University.
 - ❑ Students' performance is monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following:
 - a. Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks.
 - b. External Evaluation : 80% Marks.
 - ❑ Internal Evaluation is based on one Sessional Examination, Home Assignments, Seminars, and Library work in each semester.
 - ❑ External Evaluation will be through a Final examination at the end of each semester.
 - ❑ The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and in each practical paper is 40%.
 - ❑ In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
 - ❑ A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as per University guidelines.
 - ❑ A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers as per Gauhati University guidelines.
 - ❑ No "repeat"/ "betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any semester.
 - ❑ A student must pass all his semester examinations, including "repeat" and 'betterment' chances within five years from the date of admission to the first semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular semester examination.
- In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events, the matter maybe placed in the Committee of Courses and Studies (U.G) for amicable settlement. Since the semesters involve continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in a subject. For any matter not covered under this regulation for semester system, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) shall be applicable.
- ❑ All Final Examinations will be held as per AHSEC and Gauhati University routine.

STUDENT UNION ELECTION RULES

The college strictly abides by the recommendations of "Lyngdoh Committee" for the election of Students' Union Body in universities, colleges and other institutions of higher education across India. Some of the important recommendations are highlighted below :

6.3 Disassociation of Student Elections and Student Representation from Political Parties

6.3.1 During the period of the elections no person, who is not a student on the rolls of the college/university, shall be permitted to take part in the election process in any capacity. Any person, candidate, or member of the student organisation, violating this rule shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings, in addition to the candidature, as the case may be, being revoked.

6.5 Eligibility Criteria for Candidates

6.5.1 Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where courses often range between 4 to 5 years.

6.5.4 Although, the Committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by the candidate, the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.

6.5.5 The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the university or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.

6.5.6 The candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer, and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.

6.5.7 The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.

6.5.8 The candidate must be a regular, full time student of the college / university and should not be a distance/proximate education student. That is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full time course, the course duration being at least one year.

6.7 Code of Conduct for Candidates and Elections Administrators

6.7.1 No candidate shall indulge in, nor shall abet, any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students.

6.7.3 There shall be no appeal to caste or communal feelings for securing votes. Places of worship, within or without the campus shall not be used for election propaganda.

6.7.4 All candidates shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting, all activities which are considered to be "corrupt practices" and offences, such as bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersonation of voters, canvassing or the use of propaganda within 100 meters of polling stations, holding public meetings during the period of 24 hours ending with the hour fixed for the close of the poll, and the transport and conveyance of voters to and from polling station.

6.7.5 No candidate shall be permitted to make use of printed posters, printed pamphlets, or any other printed material for the purpose of canvassing. Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters for the purpose of canvassing, provided that such hand-made posters are procured within the expenditure limit set out herein above.

6.7.6 Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters at certain places in the campus, which shall be notified in advance by the election commission / university authority.

6.7.9 During the election period the candidates may hold processions and / or public meetings, provided that such processions and / or public meetings do not, in any manner, disturb the classes and other academic and co curricular activities of the college / university. Further, such procession / public meeting may not be held without the prior written permission of the college / university authority.

6.7.10 The use of loudspeakers, vehicles and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited.

6.7.16 In addition to the above-mentioned code of conduct, it is also recommended that certain provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Section 153A and Chapter IXA – “Offences Relating to Election”), may also be made applicable to student elections.

6.9 Maintaining Law and Order on the Campus during the Election Process

6.9.1 Any instance of acute lawlessness or the commission of a criminal offence shall be reported to the police by the university/college authorities as soon as possible, but not later than 12 hours after the alleged commission of the offence.

REGARDING ANTI-RAGGING

As per the UGC Guideline [No. F 1-16/2007 (CPP-II), April, 2009], all forms of ragging in hostels and the college campus are prohibited. Clause 3.4 of the above mentioned regulation defines “Ragging” as :

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Ragging is considered as a cognizable offence under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.

Punishable ingredients of Ragging are (1) Abetment of ragging (2) Criminal conspiracy to rag (3) Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging (4) Public nuisance created during ragging (5) Violation of decency and morals through ragging (6) Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; (7) Wrongful restraint (8) Wrongful confinement (9) Use of criminal force (10) Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences (11) Extortion (12) Criminal trespass (13) Offences against property (14) Criminal intimidation (15) Physical or psychological humiliation (16) All other offences following from the definition of ‘Ragging’ (17) Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s).

The College Authority has set up an empowered ‘Anti-Ragging Committee’. Under mentioned disciplinary actions may be taken if any student is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process
4. Withholding of results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.

6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 7. Cancellation of admission.
 8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 2 years.
 9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 10. Fine ranging between 25,000/- and 1,00,000/-.
 11. Collective punishment : When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the authority will resort to collective punishment.
- In the event of any complaint regarding ragging no one can plead ignorance to be excused from punitive action.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

HOSTEL FACILITY

The College has hostel facilities for both boys and girls. The seats are allotted strictly on merit basis. Some seats are reserved for the remote area commuters and SC / ST / OBC students. To avail hostel facility, students will have to apply separately to the principal.

Hostel Fees (for both Boys & Girls) : Rs. 7500/- (Rupees seven thousand five hundred per year)

CANTEEN

The college has a canteen to supply food in reasonable price during working hours.

XEROX FACILITY

Xerox facility is available in the college. Every student can avail this facility by paying Rs. 1/- (Rupees one) per copy.

EXCURSION

Educational tours are organized by various departments. The college also organizes excursion annually. To promote awareness of global and comprehensive understanding of educational scenario, Special Educational Tours are organized by the college. This will be undertaken during the autumn recess.

The students for these tours will be selected strictly on merit and medical fitness. The number of students for the excursion will be limited to 24, of which two will be ex-officio members of the Students' Union.

Educational Tour During Autumn Recess : Educational tour will be arranged separately by respective departments and hostel during autumn recess.

EXTRA CLASSES

Remedial and Special classes are regularly conducted for the benefit of the students.

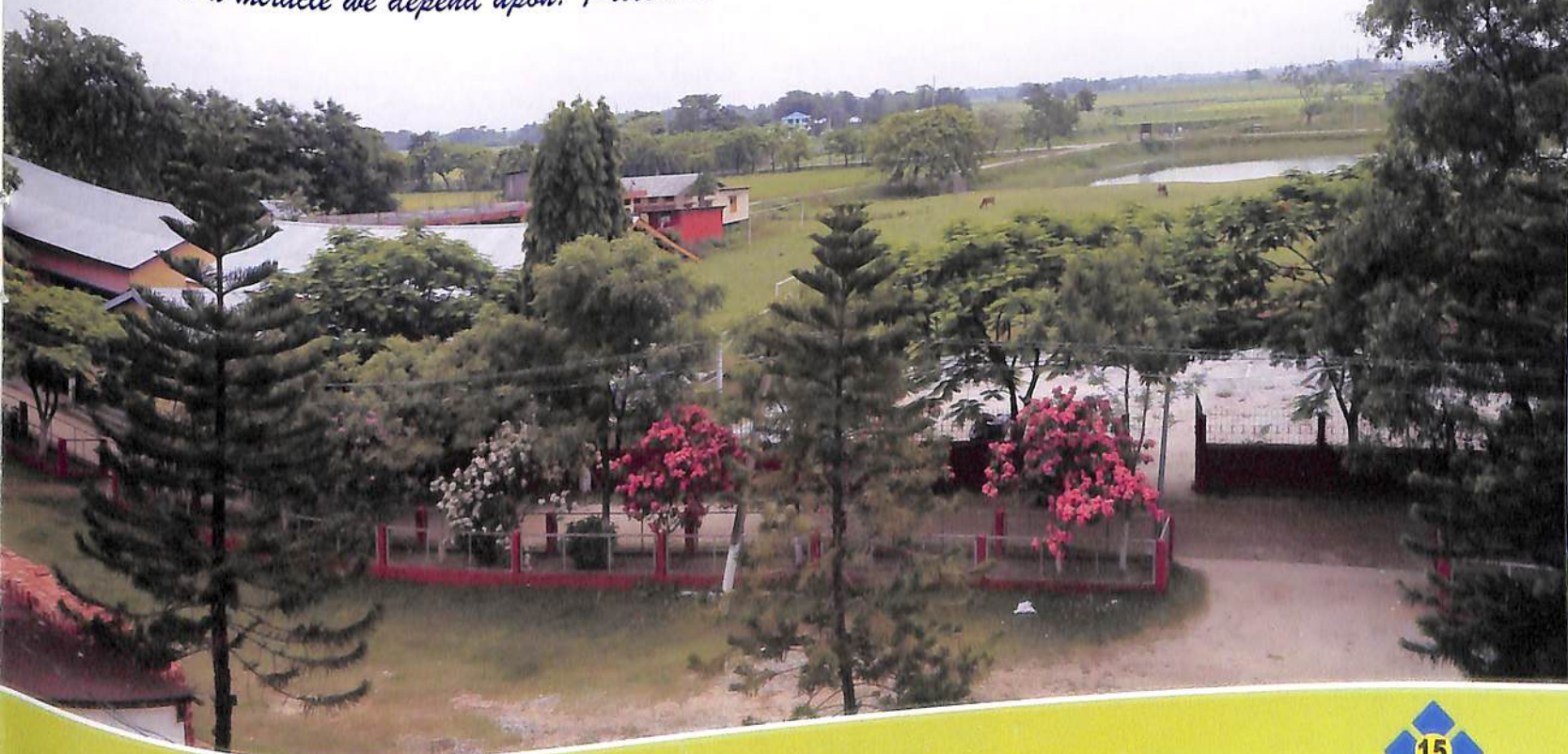

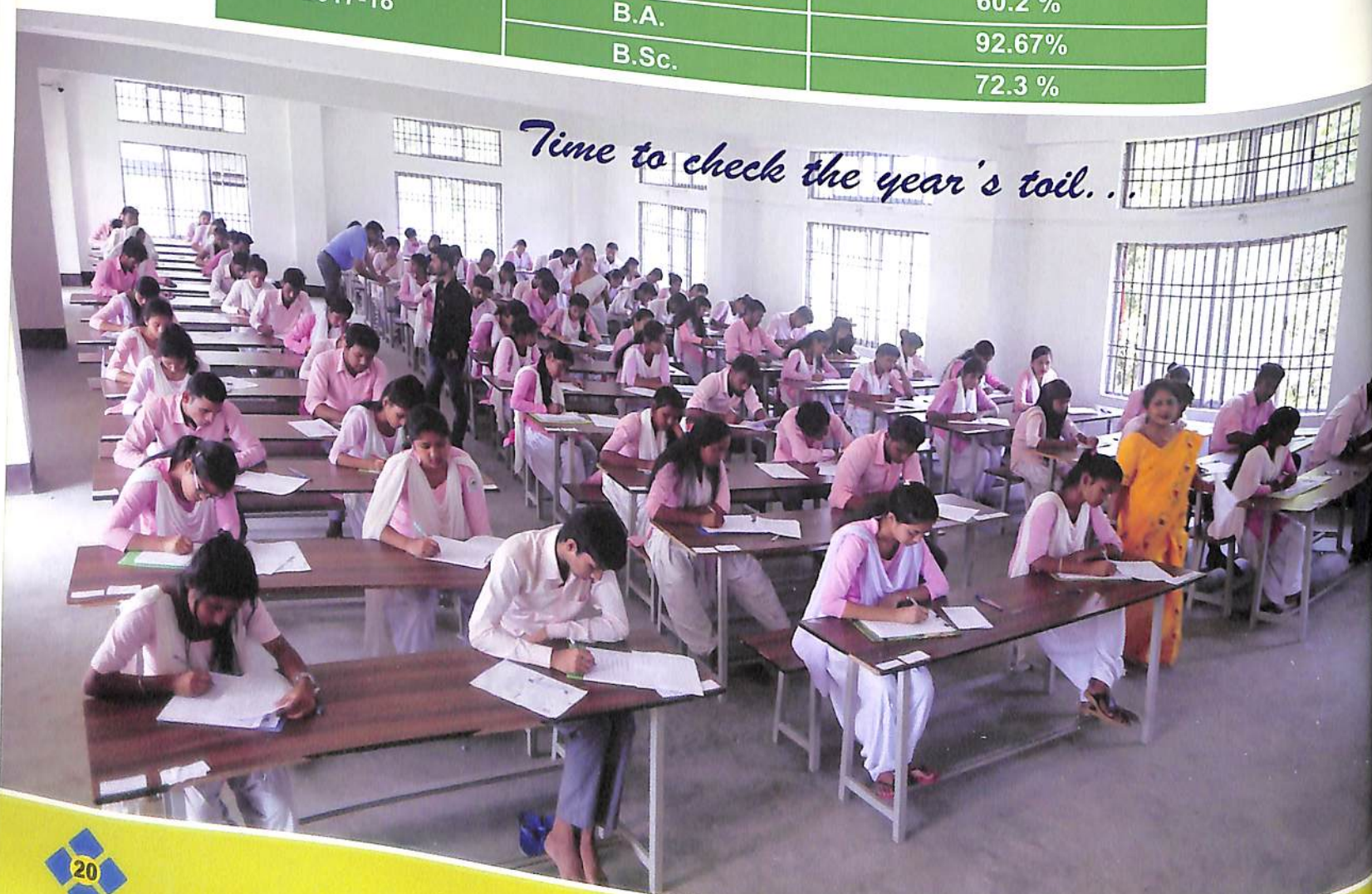
